- All frames are built of solid 3/4" oak, maple, or beech. Each rail is kiln-dried, joined by mortise and tenon, and then glued for added strength.
- Solid wood corner blocks are glued and power nailed.
- Solid wood toe kicks, 3/4" thick.
- Solid wood hanging rails on wall and base cabinets.
- End panels consist of 3-ply construction, 1/2" thick engineered wood core with hardwood veneers.
- 100 lbs. rated drawer suspension system.
- Meets HUD and KCMA ANSI 161.1 standards for cabinets.
- CARB 93120 Compliant Phase 2.
- Made in the USA.
